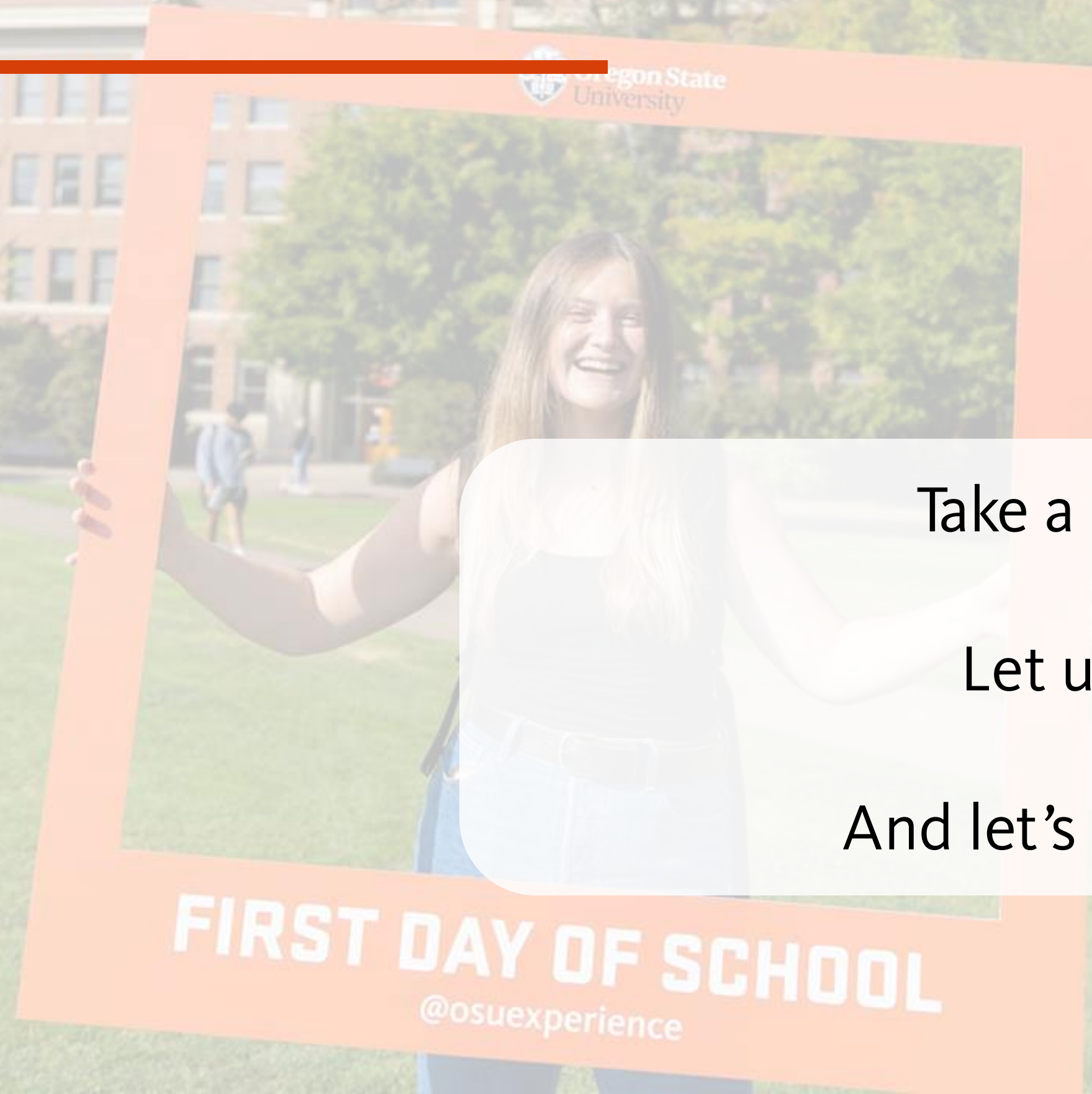

# LIVING ON CAMPUS

---

- 15 residence halls
  - 200-450 residents in each hall
  - 14 halls open to first-year students
  - Halsell set aside for transfer, grad, second year and above
- On three sides of campus: east, west, south
  - Service center on each side
  - Dining center on each side
- The Gem and 1045 SW Madison Ave. apartments for students beyond their first year of college



# WHO'S IN YOUR HALL?

---

## Resident Director (RD)

- Lives in or adjacent to the buildings of their responsibility
- Full-time professional, typically has a master's degree
- Supervised by one of four "live-on" area directors

## Student staff

- Resident Assistant (RA), Academic Learning Assistant (ALA), Diversity Learning Assistant (DLA)

## Training

- Professional and student staff receive intensive annual training on variety of topics
- Trained to assist, confront and/or refer
- Trained to use campus resources (Public Safety, campus police, counseling services) for situations beyond their scope

# BREAK HOUSING

Residents can stay on campus for no additional charge

---

- Spring Break (March 21-29, 2026)

One campus dining option will remain open, and UHDS hosts holiday meals for students and staff on campus.

# DINING ON CAMPUS

- Three dining centers

**Dining Dollars:** Used at more than 25 UHDS-managed locations

- 20% discount at dining center micro-restaurants; 10% discount in coffee shops, restaurants and markets
- Debit system
- Money added each term
- Balance rolls over for one academic year
- Available to residence hall students

**Orange Cash:** Used at most food locations on campus

- 10% discount
- Additional funds can be added
- Balance stays on student account while a student
- Available to all OSU students

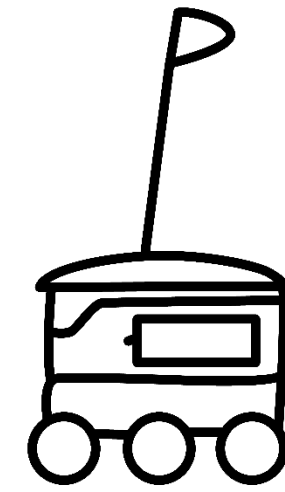

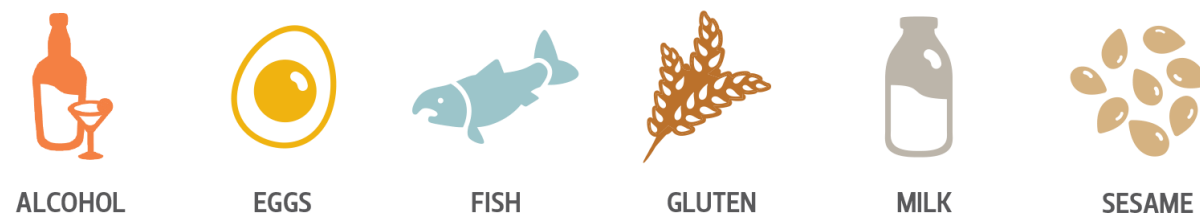

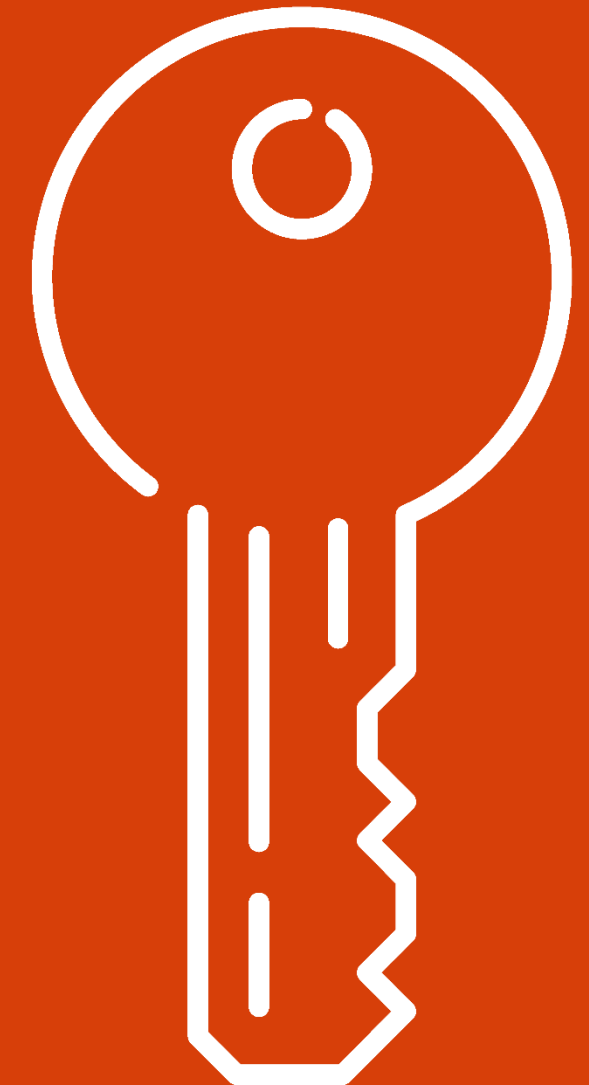

# SAFETY ON CAMPUS

---

- Trained live-in professional and student staff
- Doors locked 24 hours a day
- Partnership with Oregon State University Police Department under the Department of Public Safety
- Partnership with OSU Assist, a part of the Office of the Dean of Students
- Shared responsibility
  - Residents should not hold doors open for people they do not know or don't live in the building.
  - Residents should lock their doors when they leave their rooms or are sleeping.



# CONDUCT

---

- We provide educational interactions that can be formal or informal if a student violates policy.
- Formal processes are part of the university conduct system.
- Help your student by encouraging the respect of our policies, community and facilities and not assuming what is “the college experience.”
- Alcohol is not allowed for students under 21 and cannabis is prohibited due to federal law.

- FERPA: Our FERPA waiver is accessed through the Housing Portal by the student.
- How to support

    - About the specific issue

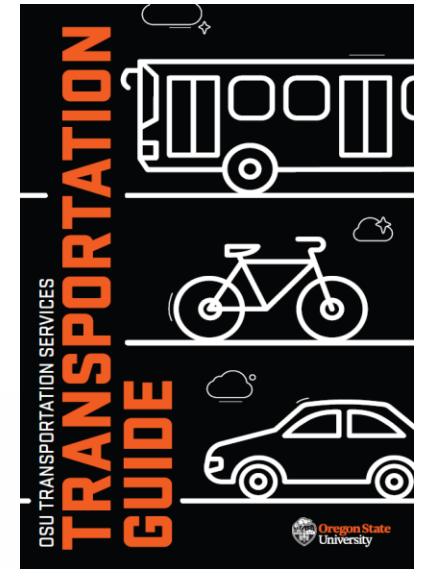
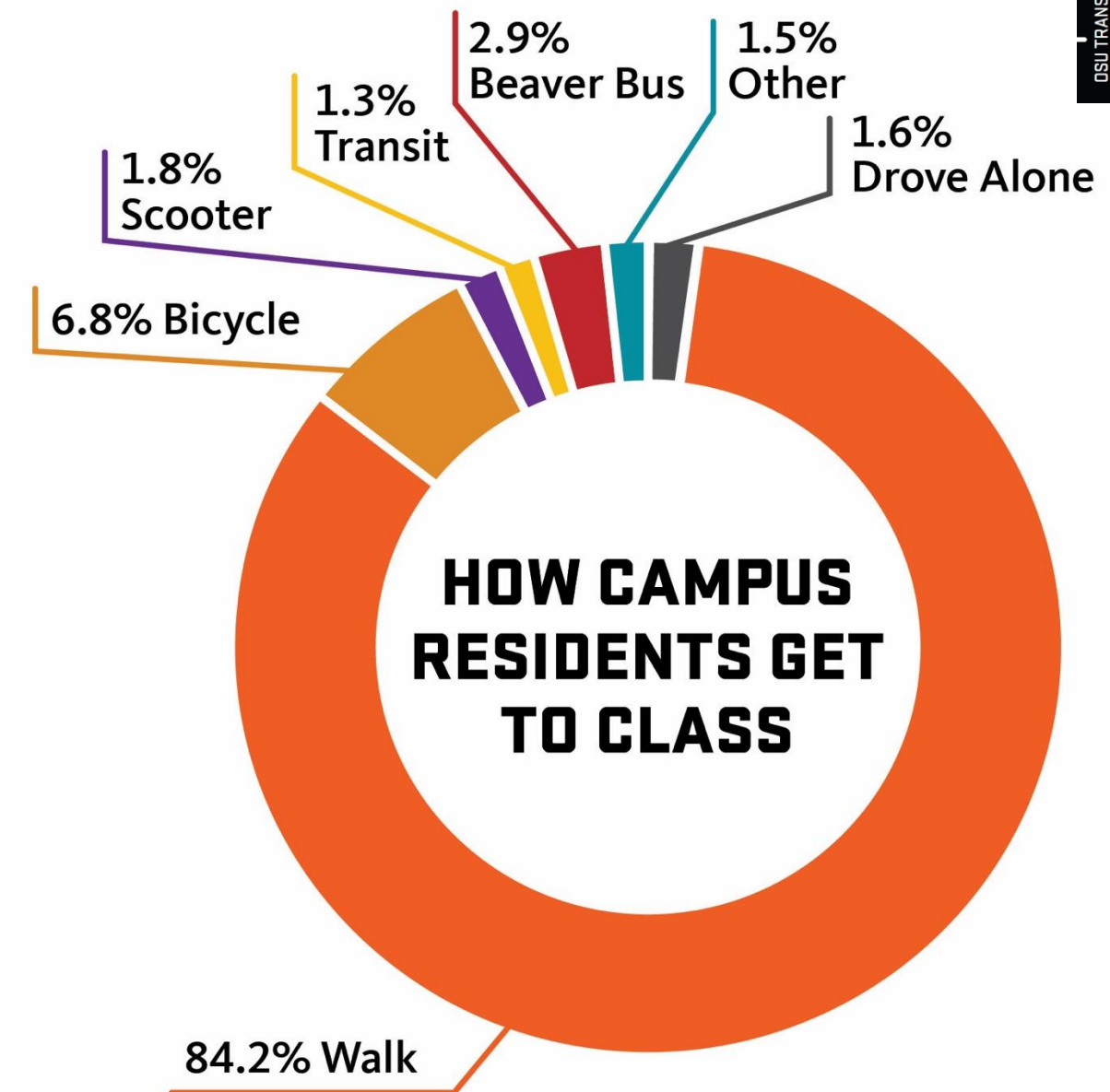

- Different than authorized user access
- Forms available for students (can be revoked at any time)

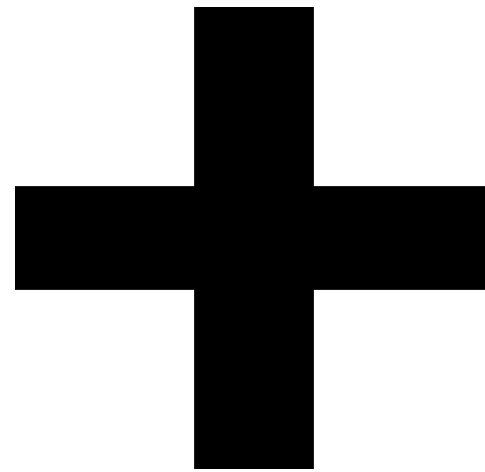

# Billing Timeline

~**6 weeks** before the start of the term

- Charges and estimated gaps displayed
- Ability to enroll in a payment plan

1 to 1.5 weeks before start of term

- Term's aid "disburses" *pays out towards OSU Bill*
  - If overpays = refund
  - If underpays = electronic bill

5<sup>th</sup> of the **month** following start of the term

- Bills emailed to students & authorized users
- Due date is 1<sup>st</sup> of the following month

# Can someone else pay the student's bill? YES

## Authorized Users

- Allows access to MyBill
- Receive email notifications (statements)
- View and print statements
- Make secure payments and enroll in payment plans
- Students have to login and grant access to authorized users
- Different than FERPA

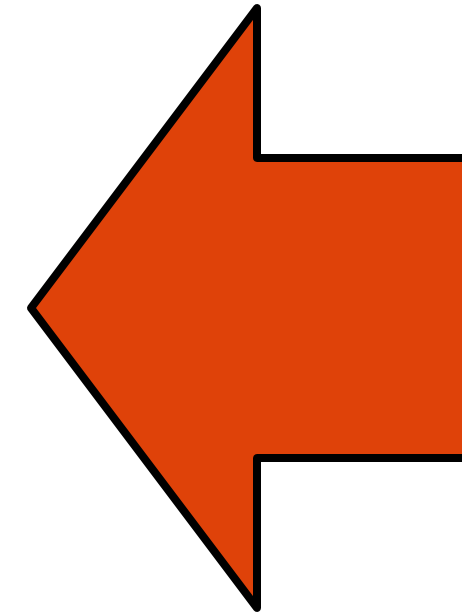

#### SUMMER TERM

Summer term charges will be posted on 6/1/2025, Housing Charges on 6/9/2025, and Financial Aid will be displayed beginning 6/3/2025. Refunds of excess aid will start the refund process on 6/14/2025, if you have direct deposit, you will have the funds within 3-5 business days of the email confirmation you receive. If you are not signed up for direct deposit, then a refund check will be mailed on 6/15/2025 and will take 10-14 days to arrive. If you haven't already signed up for direct deposit of your refund, go to Beaverhub (allow 10 business days for banking set-up to be completed).

The first summer term bill will be sent on July 5th, 2025 and is due August 1st, 2025. Any unpaid balance greater than \$500.00 will be

# Late fee and registration holds

- If the balance due is more than \$500.00 on the 1st of the month after the first bill for the term has been sent or the student is not enrolled in a payment plan a \$85.00 student account late fee is charged once per term.
- When registration opens in week 7 of the term: if the balance is greater than \$500.00 , the student is not enrolled in a payment plan or there are balances owing from a prior term, then a registration hold would be placed. Registration will be unavailable until the registration hold amount is resolved or the student enrolls in a payment plans.



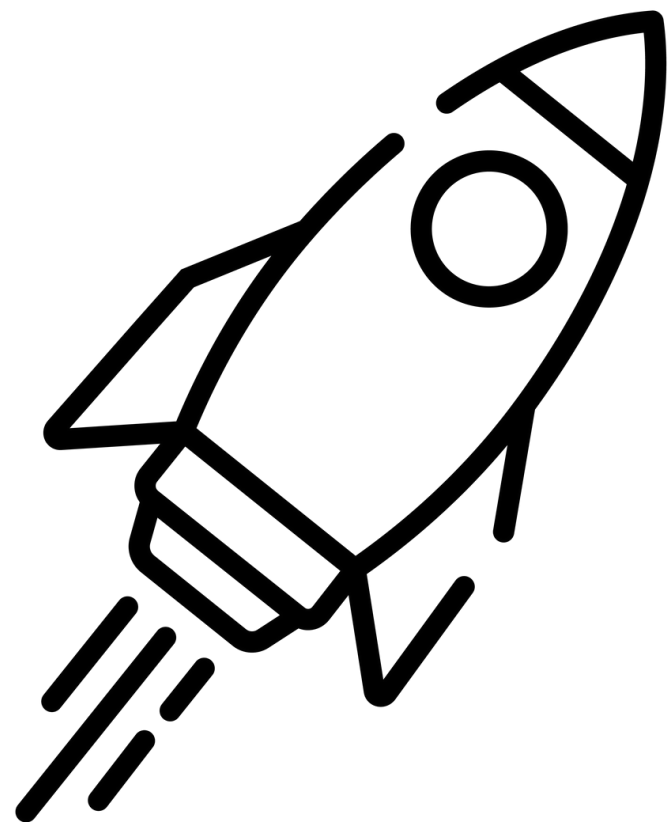

# STUDENT LOANS

## Federal Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans



By filing a FAFSA, students are automatically considered and offered Direct Subsidized and/or Direct Unsubsidized Loans.

These loans have:

- Annual Limits on How Much Students Can Borrow
- Fixed Interest Rates
- Various Repayment Plan Options
- Six Month Grace Periods

Direct Subsidized Loans are interest free while students are in deferment (not required to make payments).

## Direct PLUS Loans

Parents of dependent students can borrow a parent PLUS Loan for their student. PLUS Loans are

- Backed by the Department of Education
  - In the Parent/Borrower's Name for Repayment
  - In the Amount Requested in the PLUS Application

## Private Student Loans

Students can also borrow private or alternative loans from banks, credit unions, or other loan lenders. These vary widely based on each individual lender and borrower. If you need help finding a lender, ELMSelect is a great place to start. Compare offers to find the right loan for you!

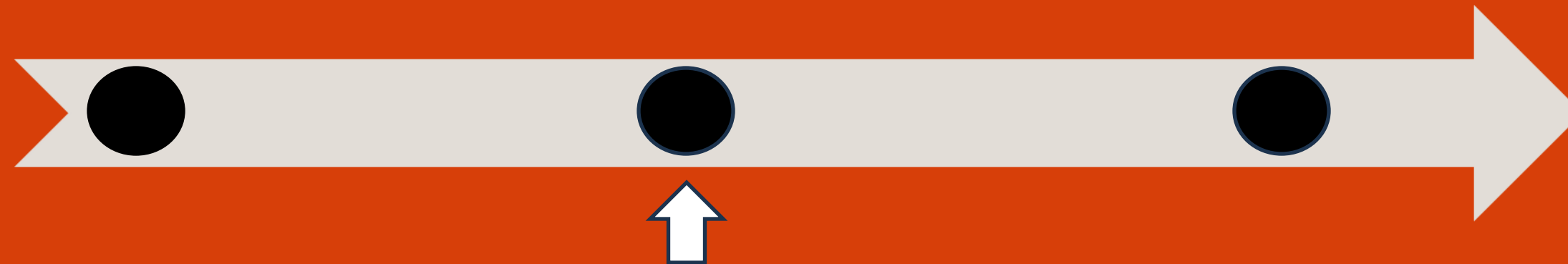

# Billing & Financial Aid Timeline

OSU Tuition charges visible on account ( about 6 weeks before the term starts)

Tuition bill sent out 5<sup>th</sup> of each month ( due the 1<sup>st</sup> of the following month)



**Financial aid is applied to your account  
7-10 days before the start of the term**

(If aid is accepted and requirements are met)

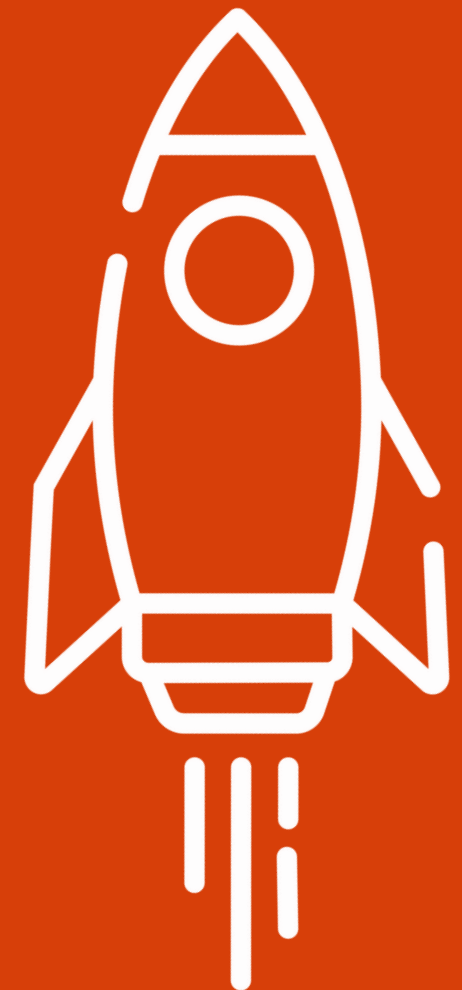
